WHEREAS, Hudson County Schools of Technology would like to establish an articulation agreement with LIM College and County Prep High School (CPHS) for graduates of the CTE program Clothing and Textiles I-IV for students who have been accepted for admission to LIM College; and

WHEREAS, Students who have achieved a cumulative "B" average (80 or higher) in CPHS Clothing and Textiles I-IV will receive the following transferable credit:

- *If four years are completed: ELEC 9999: General Elective; 6 credits (can fulfill two general/flex elective requirements)*
- *If two years are completed: ELEC 9999: General Elective; 6 credits (can fulfill one general/flex elective requirements); and*

WHEREAS, Applicant must graduate from CPHS and be accepted into LIM College as a matriculated student; and

BE IT RESOLVED, the Hudson County Schools of Technology Board of Education, approves the 2024-2027 agreement, subject to annual review, between LIM College and Hudson County Schools of Technology (HCST).

LIM College and County Prep High School Articulation Agreement

College of Agreement Initiation: LIM College

Sending BOCES Program: County Prep High School

Programs: Clothing & Textiles I-IV

Receiving College: LIM College

Programs: Transferable credits will be applicable to any LIM College degree program.

Articulation Agreement

This articulation agreement is designed for graduates of County Prep High School's Clothing & Textiles I-IV program who have been accepted for admission to LIM College.

Students who have achieved a cumulative "B" average (80 or higher) in the County Prep High School's Clothing & Textiles I-IV will receive the following transferable credit:

- *If four years are completed: ELEC 9999: General Elective; 6 credits (can fulfill two general/flex elective requirements)*
- *If two years are completed; ELEC 9999: General Elective; 3 credits (can fulfill one general/flex elective requirement)*

Additional Details:

- Applicant must graduate from their home high school.
- Applicant must be accepted to LIM College as a matriculated student.
- Upon enrollment, applicant should inform Admissions Counselor that they participated in the Clothing & Textiles I-IV program.
- Students must meet the admissions requirements for the academic year in which they are admitted. Please refer to the college catalog for complete admissions and program requirements.
- Students are required to submit an official transcript from County Prep High School in order to complete the transfer of applicable credit.
- LIM College and County Prep High School shall review and update the Articulation Agreement as necessitated by curriculum changes by either party.

Marketing & Recruitment:

LIM College and County Prep High School will work together to promote this Agreement to the participants which may include on-site events (classroom presentation and/or guidance visit) and distribution of marketing materials. The parties may utilize each other's trademarks in connection with promoting the Agreement, provided the other party pre-approves such use; neither party shall gain any right, title or interest in any name or trademark of the other party.

Termination and Modification

This Agreement is effective August 1, 2022, and shall remain in effect for five years. Thereafter, this Agreement may be extended via a written notice signed by both parties sixty (60) days prior to the end of the current term. In addition, either party may terminate this Agreement for any reason, or no reason, by providing thirty (30) days written notice to the other party. Should this Agreement be terminated, students enrolled in the Program will be afforded the opportunity to complete the semester or program.
